Opening -- Good morning / afternoon Family and Friends of _____ I am Chaplain _____ and I welcome you here today on behalf of the family of ______.

Scripture Reading (your choice or use the following if you like)

The scripture reading will be from the Gospel of John

John 14 ---- I Am the Way, and the Truth, and the Life

1"Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God;^[a] believe also in me. 2In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? 3And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. 4And you know the way to where I am going."^[b] 5Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" 6Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

Today we remember ______ who has gone to be with the Lord but remains in our hearts. He / she has been to you a friend, father / mother, husband / wife, brother / sister, grand parent ... etc. Today we both mourn his / her passing but also rejoice that he / she is now in Heaven with you O Lord.

A brief meditation from the scriptures or you may use the following:
